

TOP TRAY CLASS - RULES FOR ENTRY

Please read these regulations carefully to ensure that they are full understood and followed. Entries not following these rules will be disqualified.

1/ The Top Tray class is for a display of three types of vegetables from the following list, with the quantity of each vegetable indicated:

| 3 carrots | 3 parsnips | 6 runner beans |
| 2 cauliflowers | 6 pea pods | 6 tomatoes |
| 3 onions | 3 potatoes | |

2/ Each type of vegetable will be judged using a scale of 20 points, split into three sections. Points are awarded as follows:

Seven points for size, shape and colour

Seven points for condition

Six points for uniformity

All vegetables are to be displayed for effect.

3/ Vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 45cm x 60cm (18" x 24") without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit shall exceed the size of the tray.

4/ A tray or board to the above measurements can be used or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurements that must conform to the specified size.

5/ A black cloth is permitted and the tray may be painted.

Parsley is allowed for garnishing but **NO OTHER** foliage, garnish or accessories will be allowed.

Onion tops may be tied or whipped, using raffia.

Carrots and parsnips must have their foliage trimmed back to 2.5cm or 5.5cm long (1" or 2").

Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk.

Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces.

6/ Prizes for the Top Tray class are as follows:
